




## COMMENTARY


In the first month of the year, the BSE indexes closed in the green and the blue chips benchmark Sofix has increased its value by 1.3%. Developed markets indexes finished their rally from the end of last year and closed in the red. S&P and DAX felt by -0.16% and -1.01%, while Hang Seng shrunk by -6.66% because of the threat of further spreading of coronavirus. In January, UBB Global Child Fund felt by -2.32%.

News of the month: In January, the overall business climate indicator increased by 1.4 points compared to December last year, due to the more optimistic expectations about manufacturing entrepreneurs; The consumer price index for December 2019 compared to November 2019 is 100.7%, i.e. the monthly inflation is 0.7%. The annual inflation rate for December 2019 compared to December 2018 is 3.8%.
